## Rheumatic Fever

Rheumatic fever is an autoimmune disease, which means there is a problem with the immune system – the cells and organs that protect the body against illnesses and infections. It happens when your child’s immune system makes a mistake and attacks your child’s heart instead of the germs from an illness.

While the symptoms of rheumatic fever may disappear on their own, the inflammation can cause rheumatic heart disease, where there is scarring of the heart valves. Almost all cases of rheumatic fever, rheumatic heart disease and associated deaths are preventable.

## Healthy Home

Recent changes to the Residential Tenancy act mean that by 1 July 2019 all rental properties must have ceiling and underfloor insulation meeting a set standard, where reasonably practicable.

### Criteria for insulation funding

There are a limited number of grants for 50% of the cost - these are available on a first come first served basis if the rental property meets the following criteria;

- Rental property was built before the year 2000
- Named tenant has a Community Services Card
